
Evangelism Conference



God is building his Church!


CONFERENCE RECAPS

Defining the Faith

Throughout 5 days of training, Pastor Jim covered 19 lectures about apologetics by walking through the Apostles Creed. Chapel staff and a group from College Hill Reformed Church spent the week listening to apologetics instruction during the day, and going out to do evangelism at night. In the evenings, we met and listened to counseling training to better equip us for our conversations with the lost. We learned about the beauty and logic of the Christian worldview, how to refute objections, and received the reminder that the focus should always be on the Gospel.


Thursday night, we saw amazing fruit. A team from the Chapel brought the Gospel to a man on the Boardwalk who called on the name of the Lord! Praise the Lord for the Chapel team who were ready to share their hope with the lost. Praise the Lord for apologetics training that equips and emboldens us in that proclamation!





Defending the Faith

Pastor Zozzaro kicked off the week by teaching us about different categories of worldviews—such as atheism, monism, and dualism—and as the week progressed, he taught us about God's sovereignty, and the hope that we have in Christ. He also spent a portion of time on what is often presented as the greatest dilemma for Christians: the "problem of evil". Alongside logical, philosophical, Scriptural explanations for the existence of evil, Pastor Zozzaro pointed out something important. Oftentimes when people struggle to reconcile God's goodness with the presence of evil, it is because those people have suffered terribly. So when we evangelize, when we share the Gospel with the lost, we need to reach out to them with the love of Christ, loving the hurting as Christ loves. When we engage in apologetics, it must be out of love and compassion, and centered around the hope of the Gospel.




MESSAGE FROM OUR EVANGELISM DIRECTOR



I am happy to report that staff are very prepared for the summer ministry as well as leading the youth groups and leading church groups in evangelism. As many of you know, we have split Pastor Jim's training week into 2 separate training weeks. Spacing out the training weeks allowed us to do more 'field practice'. In the past, we crammed a whole bunch of classroom teaching into two weeks. This year, by spacing out the training into three weeks, every night we got to go out for a couple hours. It gave the less experienced staff members more chances to go out and get experience with more skilled evangelists.

One of the things that the Lord has really been pressing on my mind and heart is 1 Corinthians 15:58, which is: 'Always be steadfast and immovable, abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.' I've had more of an awareness that what we do here (the seeds that we sow, every conversation we have with anyone about the Gospel, the words we share) regardless of what the response is, we can be confident that the Lord is going to bring fruit from that in some way. That is something the Lord has been impressing on my heart, and encouraged me with.



All of this was really highlighted for me one night. During our program, there was a man and his wife with their two young kids. And he shared with me, 'Oh, we're believers. This is wonderful, the work you've been doing is wonderful.' He said, 'In 2006, I was in front of the Chapel, and someone shared the Gospel with me. I didn't receive it at the time, but it planted a seed. Five years later I became a Christian.' Now, here he is vacationing with his family for the week, and they pray every morning for missionaries. He said his son prays every morning for the Boardwalk Chapel. So whoever shared the Gospel with him at the time just saw someone who didn't receive the Gospel, didn't receive the Word. And they didn't see the immediate fruit. But their labor was not in vain. And God sent him to encourage us. That planted a seed, that resulted in faith five years later.
